Course Outline: During the two semesters of Measure and Integration we will cover chapters 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6 of Folland and additional topics, time permitting.

Homework advice: In order to receive the full benefit from homework, you are strongly urged to spend significant time (5 solid hours at the minimum) working solo on each homework assignment before any sort of collaborative effort.

Grade Policy: 10% of your grade will be based on the homework, 90% on the midterm and final exam.
